Transport

There are different public transport services in Barcelona: Metro, bus, tram or taxi. You can check the city's various types of transport tickets and travel cards:

- A one-way public transport journey in Barcelona costs 2.40€ and is only valid for a one-way journey without any transfers between the various means of transportation. You can purchase a single ticket in any of the ticket offices and ticket vending machines at the entrance of any of the city's subway stations or from the bus drivers.
- The T Casual travel card is a 10-journey ticket and allows transfers, but only in a limited time frame. You can use up to four different types of means of transport and three changes.
- The travel card Hola BCN! is the perfect travel pass for travelers that are visiting Barcelona for 2, 3, 4, or 5 days. It includes unlimited access to the city's public transport and includes metro journeys between the Airport and the city center.

Apps such as Uber, Bolt or Cabify can also be used.

Weather

In Barcelona, October is a warm month, with temperatures ranging from 23 degrees Celsius during the day to 17 degrees Celsius at night. Days will have approximately 11 hours of sunlight.

October is usually a relatively dry month in Barcelona. The amount of rain tends to be low, with little chance of precipitation. However, occasionally there may be some light showers.

Payment information

Visa and MasterCard are widely accepted, while American Express and Diners Club are accepted at a limited number of places. Please note that you may be charged an extra fee, depending on your bank's policy.

ATMs are widespread around the city, but you can pay by card nearly everywhere.

Tipping is not mandatory in Barcelona. People tend to tip based on their degree of satisfaction with the service received. The amount of the tip is voluntary.



Emergency numbers

112 is the European general emergency number, reachable from stationary and mobile phones, free of charge, everywhere in Spain.



Wireless internet

High-quality wireless internet will be available during the conference. Use is free of charge, and the network will give unlimited access to the internet. No security measures (spam filters, firewalls) will be provided for (or against) individual users.

The password to the wireless network will be provided at the CNMC headquarter.



Electrical plugs

In Spain, the power supply is 230V and power plugs and sockets are type C.
