

## The HM hospital group acknowledges its failure to report the acquisition of sole control of the Hospital General de la Santísima Trinidad and pays the fine

- In December 2024, the group's parent company (PME) acquired sole control of the Hospital General de la Santísima Trinidad through its subsidiary Hospital de Salamanca.
- PME and Hospital de Salamanca should have notified the CNMC of the transaction before executing it, in accordance with the Spanish Competition Act.
- The Commission terminates the infringement proceedings against the parent company and its subsidiary because they acknowledge their responsibility and pay the fine in advance.

Madrid, 8 August 2025. The Spanish National Markets and Competition Commission (CNMC) has fined Profesionales de la Medicina y de la Empresa, S.A. (PME) €83,000 and its subsidiary, Hospital de Salamanca (HM Salamanca), €23,700 for acquiring exclusive control of the Hospital General de la Santísima Trinidad (Hospital ST) without prior notification (SNC/DC/090/25).

This practice is known in competition jargon as gun jumping and involves breaching Article 9.1 of the <u>Spanish Competition Act</u>, which requires companies to notify their transactions before executing them.

In February 2025, HM Salamanca pre-notified the concentration *ad cautelam*, following a request for information from the CNMC. In May, the CNMC opened infringement proceedings for this breach (<u>press release</u>). On 4 June, HM Salamanca notified the operation and on 25 June, the Commission authorised it in first phase without commitments (<u>C/1566/25</u>).

## Admission of infringement and reduction of the fine

During the infringement proceedings, HM Salamanca and PME acknowledged their responsibility and invoked <u>Article 85.3 of Law 39/2015</u>, which allows for a reduction of up to 40% of the penalty amount (finally HM Salamanca paid €14,220 and PME paid €49,800) if the company accepts responsibility for the breach and pays in advance.

In view of the above, the CNMC has terminated the infringement proceedings:
